

## **Joseph Levy Education Fund – Guidance for Applicants**

**Please read this document before you begin filling in our application form as it will help you to do so**

### **1. About the Joseph Levy Education Fund:**

We know that furthering your education when you have Cystic Fibrosis can be a challenge. The Joseph Levy Education Fund exists to help with some of the additional financial costs associated with studying while living with Cystic Fibrosis.

The Education Fund provides eligible students with an annual grant. The size of grant depends in part on the number of applications we receive. In previous years the average grant has been £600. We make grants twice a year . in June and December. The **deadlines** for us to receive applications are:

- 31<sup>st</sup> May
- 30<sup>th</sup> November

### **2. How to apply:**

You can apply by submitting an application online at [www.jlef.org.uk](http://www.jlef.org.uk) or by printing our form from the Apply section of our website, completing it and posting it to us.

### **3. Eligibility criteria:**

To apply to the Education Fund you must:

- Have Cystic Fibrosis.
- Be a UK resident.
- Want help to take a course at an accredited university, college or other educational institution or course provider.
- Be 18 or over at the time your course is due to start (although we will accept applications from people aged 16 or 17 who are not moving into formal further education and who wish instead to undertake vocational training).

You can apply again to the Education Fund if you have received a grant from us in the past. You can only submit one application per year.

### **4. What we will support:**

Our grants can be used to help with the costs of studying . particularly the additional costs associated with having Cystic Fibrosis. For example:

- to contribute towards living costs . such as travel (to and from college or for hospital visits), accommodation (eg the additional costs of having ensuite accommodation or keeping your accommodation warm enough), high calorie food costs.
- to purchase educational materials (eg books or equipment).
- to contribute to course fees where these are not fully covered by a student loan or funds from other sources (eg bursaries).

## 5. Examples of courses we have previously supported:

### Academic Courses (usually provided by universities and colleges):

- BA and BSc degrees
- Masters and PhD degrees
- Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE / PGCertEd)
- AAT Level 2 Accounting Qualification

### Vocational Courses (usually courses that prepare people to work in a specific trade):

- NVQ level 3 in Beauty Therapy
- Driving Instructor training
- Creative Writing Courses

## 6. Restrictions and exclusions:

We will not fund:

- The costs of studying at a private institution unless you can demonstrate there is no alternative course available at a statutory provider (such as a further education college).
- Gym fees: the Cystic Fibrosis Trust offers grants for this . please see <https://www.cysticfibrosis.org.uk/life-with-cystic-fibrosis/support-available/financial-support/health-and-wellbeing-grants>
- Repayment of a student loan or other debts.

## 7. Paying our grants:

We normally pay our grants in a single payment by cheque shortly after each grants round.

## 8. Guidance on completing the application form:

Please read through these notes carefully before completing the form. You must complete all sections of the form. The decision to shortlist your application for further consideration will be made based on the information you provide. Incomplete applications will not be assessed.

When completing the application, please bear in mind the following:

- Parts 5, 6 and 7: Your income and expenditure information enables us to know the total cost of undertaking the course and how you plan to meet those costs. If there is too great a shortfall between the two sums, it may suggest that a small contribution from the Joseph Levy Education Fund would not be sufficient to enable you to undertake your studies. In this case, your application to us is unlikely to succeed.
- Part 5: Course Costs: For courses lasting more than one year please tell us about the costs for the next year rather than for the whole of the course. For courses lasting less than a year please give us the amounts for the whole course.
- Part 8: Although our average grant is £600 you can apply for more than this as we may award a higher amount in some cases. Please tell us clearly why you need financial help and how you would spend the grant as this will help us to decide how much to award.
- Part 9: We need this information to be able to verify the details of your application during our assessment process. You should tell the people you list in this section that we may contact them about your application. Please ensure that the contact information you give for your referees is up to date as it may delay your application if we cannot contact them.

## **9. You must include the following items with your application:**

- Brief details from your course provider of your proposed course of study.

## **10. Conditions of grant:**

If you are awarded a grant you must:

- Confirm to us that you have a place on the course before we will release the cheque to you.
- Provide us with evidence that you have taken the course as planned and give us feedback about how the grant has helped you (please see our Grant Monitoring Form below).
- Keep us updated about any changes to your contact details.
- Be able to provide copies of receipts for any equipment you purchase with the grant.
- Give permission for us to use any information that you provide about the impact of the grant in order for us to promote the Education Fund to potential applicants or to raise additional money for the Education Fund . including through social media or any other promotional methods or materials. We will only use this information in ways that ensure you cannot be identified. If the Education Fund wishes to use this information in a way that would identify you . for example as one of the case studies on our website - we will only do so if you give us your consent in advance.
